

Lester B. Pearson Newsletter - December 3, 2023


Dear Students, Parents, Guardians and Caregivers,

Our juniors started their season with the Northside Invitational. Lots of great ball and lessons learned in preparation for the start of league.


















Student support, leadership and volunteerism are at the core of the Pearson Community. They have my heartfelt thanks and appreciation.
